Title: Knowing God in His Attributes

Text: Exodus 34:6-7

Theme: God is profoundly perfect in his attributes.

One: God's attributes are essential.

- Meaning, of his essence
- Permanent; unchanging
- God is the definition of the attributes

Two: God's attributes are unified.

- God is simple; not made of parts
- This simplicity is reflected in our sanctification by the fruit of the Spirit.
- Most common error = elevating the attribute of love above all other attributes.

Three: God's attributes are anthropomorphic.

- Anthropos = man; morphs = form
- Definition: describing God in human terms
- God stoops to speak to us in a way that we can understand
- God stoops to dwell among us so that we can be saved.
