Title: A Savior Who is Christ the Lord

Text: Luke 2:1-14

Theme: A Portrait of the Savior.

For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior who is Christ the Lord. ~ Luke 2:11

One: you = a needed Savior

Two: *unto* = a given Savior

Three: *is born* = a human Savior

Four: *this day* = a storied Savior

Five: in the city of David = a promised Savior


Six: who is Christ = a divine Savior

Seven: *the Lord* = a ruling Savior

Conclusion: *for* = God has sent Jesus for our joy
